Records from the 2003 field season

During the last field season the group collected some 3500 records, the very large majority of them for parishes with few recent records in the database. If any of you still have record cards for 2003 please send them to me as soon as possible.

The first year of the BSBI Local Change Survey progressed well, with all but one of the eight tetrads receiving a number of recording visits during the season. Additional visits to those tetrads which require further recording effort in order to ensure that all species, as far as practicable, have been found will take place this year.

During the winter I have been inputting records from Wildlife Trust survey work carried out in the 1990s; so far I have completed Fenland and East Cambridgeshire Districts but there are still many survey reports to go. In total, including all records input by Derek Wells, the database now stands at about 123,000 records.

Many thanks to all those who attended one or more of the 2003 excursions; we hope to see you all again, plus some new faces, this year.

Excursions in 2004

This year the format of a couple of excursions has been altered to allow some time for botanising in a group. We hope this will provide an opportunity to socialise, to share knowledge and to increase the skills and experience of the less practiced botanists in the group.

The April excursion will start at 10.00am and we will spend the morning botanising in a group in and around Brinkley Wood. After lunch I will be at the afternoon meeting point at 2.00pm in order to meet those who wish to attend in the afternoon only. The format of the afternoon session will follow that of recent years, with people being divided into pairs/groups and assigned areas from which to record. As before, the afternoon session will finish around 4.30pm or so.

Similarly, the May excursion will have a morning session exploring one or more of the Soham commons and an afternoon session spent at large in the parish.
